



Cleanfill Declaration Agreement

Due to resource consent conditions Road Metals are required to have a signed written agreement with our clients to acknowledge that the material deposited at our cleanfill sites meets the acceptance of our consent conditions and within the Ministry for Environment (MFE) guidelines.

No material will be accepted that has been identified on ECan's Listed Land Use Register (LLUR) as originating from a site where hazardous activities and industries have been located (HAIL).

Any site that has had a detailed site investigation report completed by a suitably qualified and experienced environmental practitioner (SQEP) may be forwarded to Road Metals for approval prior to transporting the material to site.

All details as to where the cleanfill material originates from and who has deposited the material is recorded at our cleanfill sites and if contaminated material was found to be deposited then it would be the client's responsibility to remove the material at their own cost.

By signing this agreement your company is confirming that the material deposited is in compliance with the outlined acceptance criteria.

This agreement covers all cleanfill sites operated by Road Metals in Canterbury.
